DYROS CAVE

Characterized as one of the most beautiful lake caves in the world, it was first explored in 1950 by the Petrocheilos pair of cavers. It is also recognized as one of the most important Neolithic caves of Europe

Dyros cave consists of three parts: Alepotrypa, Katafygi and Kamari.

The visit is made by small boats . The total duration of the tourist route (terrestrial and lacustrine) is 1,500 feet (35 min) by boat and on foot. The Alepotrypa was inhabited during the Neolithic era and had been used continuously for over 2000 years.

At the entrance of the prehistoric cave of Alepotripa in Dyros are exhibited the findings that the excavations that brought to light the life of a populous and dynamic Neolithic community that lived and flourished in the cave from 5300 to 3200 BC Amongst the many important findings , are the fossilized skeletons of two panthers .
